ROYAL MAIL CURRENT POSTAGE STAMPS – USE BY 31 JANUARY 2023

From 1st February 2023 regular familiar stamps will no longer be valid. They are now being replaced by barcoded stamps.

Special issue stamps with pictures on and previous Christmas stamps without a barcode continue to be valid.

The ideal time to use non-barcoded stamps will be during December for your Christmas cards and parcels.

You can swap non-barcoded stamps for new but not at a Post Office. NVI stamps are Non Value Indicator such as 1st and 2nd class with the profile of HM the Queen.
