

## GSL'S REPORT

The Group has started the year on a positive note. I have recently completed the yearly census for 2022 and it is great news that 1st Tolworth is growing! The census records start in 2001 and the number of young people in the Group at that time, bearing in mind we had two Beaver Colonies and two Cub Packs, was 90.

The total remained between 64 and 99 from 2001 to 2012.

2013 we were back up to 81 and stayed between 81 and 77 until 2019 when it dropped to 66.

Covid then took hold of the Group just like all other Scout Groups. Our numbers dropped to 58 in 2020 and 30 in in 2021!

As Covid restrictions eased and we could all get back to Scouting, we had more people wanting their children to join. In 2022 our young people numbers doubled and we were up to 60 and this year we have a small increase in young people and we are now at 62.

We have a lot of work to do to get our numbers back up! We currently have a small waiting list for Beavers. If we continue to grow we will need more people to help run the sections, as we are almost at the stage where our current leaders can't take any more young people.

Congratulations and welcome home to Stuart Duffell and Alex O'Sullivan, who are both Assistant Scout Leaders with the Scout Troop. They have been in Australia for the past year working and travelling. While they were away I received their Wood Badge beads which means they have both completed their training!

Depending on what role you do depends on how much training you need to do. If you volunteer, it doesn't mean you have to wear a uniform and commit to a lot of training. As an occasional helper you only need a DBS check. As a Section Assistant there are four on line modules you do at home and each one takes no more than 45 minutes and do not have to be done all in one go.

We had intended to have a Reindeer Race Night before Christmas but due to the football it was cancelled. I am pleased to say we are having an Easter Bunny Race instead!

## EVEREST CUB SCOUT REPORT

Our Cubs have been very busy this term learning new skills, earning badges, and having lots of fun!

On our first evening back in January we ran a Life Skills session which covered a large portion of the Skills Challenge Badge. Cubs learnt how to change a light bulb, pump up a flat bicycle tyre, tie a tie, iron their scarf and sew on a button (with varying degrees of success).

The following week we played some team games and also began working on our Community Impact Badge. This badge enables Cub Scouts to make a positive difference by tackling issues faced within their local community. Our topic was disability discrimination and Guide/Assistance Dog access.

I shared some of my personal experiences of discrimination and talked about the impact of being illegally refused access to taxis, shops, restaurants and more, due to having a Guide/Assistance Dog. Being turned away from somewhere because of my disabilities leaves me feeling upset, vulnerable and like a second-class citizen. It is against the law, but is unfortunately something that I and many other Assistance Dog handlers encounter regularly. It should not be happening.

For our project, the Cubs wrote letters to the Prime Minister, asking him to strengthen the laws protecting Guide and Assistance Dog handlers from discrimination and introduce clear penalties for breaking this law. We have received a reply from the Correspondence Officer at 10 Downing Street and our letters have been passed on to the Government Equalities Office.

For the Teamwork Challenge Badge, Cubs worked together in groups to recreate Tower Bridge using biscuits and sweets which they thoroughly enjoyed eating afterwards! I was

pleasantly surprised with the results as they all looked fantastic. Picking a winning team was very difficult.







We also had a go at soap carving this term, which left the hall smelling beautiful! Cubs carved their bars into hearts, fishes, rabbits, stars, cats, and even the World Scout logo. This was again done with varying degrees of success, but everyone gave it a good go and had fun trying something different.

For our final meeting before half term we went to Hollywood Bowl. Everyone had a good time and it was great to see several of the Cubs progress from using the ramp to bowling independently by the end of the session.

We have lots of exciting activities planned for the rest of term and are looking forward to the warmer weather so that we can do some more outdoor based activities.

Thank you as always to our fantastic leadership team, all of whom volunteer their time freely to make Scouting possible for the young people. If you would like to help, please get in touch or speak to me at the end of the meeting. Parent helpers are always welcome!
